Undergraduate Exchange Eligibility

Our undergraduate exchange program (Commerce) is offered as a fall, winter, or full-year exchange. It is strongly recommended that all applicants have successfully completed at least 6 foundation courses in Business and/or Economics at their home school. Students must be enrolled in an undergraduate program or in M1 of a Master's program in order to be admitted to the Commerce program.

Exam Accommodations

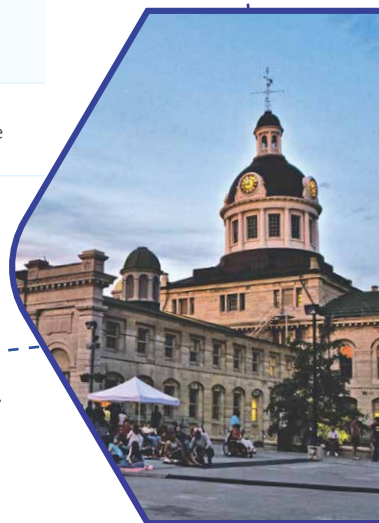
An extra 30 minutes and a translation dictionary (not electronic dictionary) are permitted for exchange students whose first language is not English and who were required to submit a language test with their Smith School of Business, Queen's University exchange application (final exams only).

Workload

- 36 Contact hours per course (equivalent to 6.5–7 ECTS)
- Each classroom hour, students should plan for approximately 3 hours of additional independent and/or teamwork
- Undergraduate exchange students are required to enroll in 3–5 courses during their exchange at Smith School of Business, and should also follow any additional course requirements set by their home school

Class Format

- Small class sizes between 55–89 students per class.
- Variety of teaching methods to form a well-rounded learning environment, including lectures, presentations, teamwork, simulations, and case studies.
- Attendance is mandatory for all classes.
- Students are encouraged to be active participants; most classes will include a participation grade.

Health Insurance

Mandatory: University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

UHIP medical insurance offers coverage for basic services such as emergency hospital visits and physical examinations. UHIP does not cover supplementary medical services, such as dental work or physiotherapy.

Students who hold a Canadian citizenship and are studying from another country may still be eligible for UHIP depending on period of stay. Please email smithexchange@queensu.ca for more information.

Fees (based on 2025/26 rate and are approximate)

One term: \$264 / **Two Terms:** \$528

Mandatory fees will automatically be applied to each student's account.

Supplementary Medical Insurance: Private international medical insurance is recommended for supplementary medical coverage.

Visa and Study Permit

Entry Visa: Citizens of certain countries and territories will require either a [Visa](#) or an [Electronic Travel Authorization \(eTA\)](#) to visit Canada.

Study Permit: A [study permit](#) is required for anyone who wants to study in Canada for six months or more.
