

Master of International Business

Smith's Master of International Business (MIB) program provides students with a unique learning experience that focuses on creating dynamic cross-cultural leaders that can demonstrate a global perspective. Our unique team-based approach and applied curriculum specifically prepares students for the workplace and provides graduates with access to one of Canada's strongest and most committed alumni networks.

Program Eligibility

Incoming Double Degree students must meet the following criteria:

- Incoming Double Degree students must be regularly enrolled, for the duration of the program, in a Master's degree as per our partnership agreement with your home institution.

The Application Process

- You must submit your official transcripts and resume via the application link provided after you have been nominated by your home university.
- Video Essay: You will be asked three randomized questions which are designed to be answered without any advance preparation. There will also be a question that requires a 150-word response which you will have 5 minutes to complete (please note, you will only have two weeks to complete this item).
- Once you have completed the online application, you will receive further information and guidance from our office.

Internship Option

- Students from some partners may be eligible to incorporate a semester-long (3-4 month) paid internship into their degree path.

MIB Course Structure

Our course structure will be dictated by the agreement with your home institution and confirmed during the enrollment process.

- MIB courses are delivered in a modular format, ranging in length from 4-6 weeks per course.

Program Launch

The MIB program starts in late August with a mandatory session that will include orientation activities and academic content. All incoming students are expected to be in Kingston for the Program Launch.

Course Information

Workload

- Smith's courses are demanding with ongoing assessment, teamwork, final projects, and/or exams. For every hour of class time, students should plan for approximately 3–4 hours of additional independent and/or teamwork.
- 3.0 unit courses are 30–36 contact hours (equivalent to 6–7.5 ECTS)

Class Format

- Lectures, presentations, teamwork, and case studies.

Academic Integrity




Grading Scale

Health Insurance

Mandatory: University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP)

UHIP medical insurance offers coverage for basic services like emergency hospital visits and physical examinations. UHIP does not cover supplementary medical services, such as dental work or physiotherapy. International students must have primary health insurance provided by UHIP for the duration of their time in Canada. Fees are subject to change from year to year.

Students who hold a Canadian citizenship and are studying from another country may still be eligible for UHIP depending on period of stay. Please email smithgradexchange@queensu.ca for more information.

Fees (based on previous year's 2025/26 rate and are approximate).

One term: \$264 / Two Terms: \$528

Mandatory fees will automatically be applied to each student's account.

Supplementary Medical Insurance: Private international medical insurance is recommended for supplementary medical coverage.

Study Permit

A study permit is required for anyone who wants to study in Canada for six months or more. All double-degree students must obtain a study permit.
